
Four worlds of diversity

Slovenia is the junction of the Alps and the Mediterranean, the Karst and the Pannonian Plain. With a tent or a caravan, a motorhome or just your personal luggage to accommodate you in pre-built mobile homes or in surprisingly different glamping accommodation, you can stop off in any of these different environments. In Alpine Slovenia you can gaze at the peaks of mighty mountains, in Mediterranean and Karst Slovenia the wind from the sea caresses you, in thermal Pannonian Slovenia you are close to the springs of healing waters and in Ljubljana and Central Slovenia you are close to UNESCO World Heritage sites. Since everything in Slovenia is close by, you can get to know all the diversity of Slovenia with day trips from your chosen starting point.

2 From pitches to original houses

Campsites are available all over Slovenia. In addition to the standard well-equipped pitches for tents, caravans and motorhomes, many operators also offer ready-made accommodation (luxury glamping tents, mobile homes, bungalows, apartments). Wherever you go you can count on a network of well-equipped car parks and motorhome stops. Slovenia's speciality is its glamorous and unique, original and themed houses surrounded by nature. These architecturally distinctive accommodation options are often linked to experiences of local stories and special features.







Recommended by connoisseurs

In addition to the national categorisation, the quality of many campsites is demonstrated by the ratings of internationally renowned associations and organisations (ADAC, ACSI, ANWB, etc.) and recommendations from portals such as Trip Advisor. Many campsites carry a label for specialised hiking or cycling accommodation. Some campsites boast the Slovenia Green Accommodation label.

Starting points for numerous experiences

The campsites have various playgrounds, common areas, etc. Most of them offer interesting opportunities for activities in nature. The campsites that are distributed all over Slovenia provide an excellent starting point for cycling and hiking in our green country. Many other activities typical of the area, local culinary offer, cultural highlights and events, and the unique 5-star experiences are also worth exploring. You can rely on the recommendations of campsite employees and the readily available tourist information.


Responsible towards nature

Here, everything is close by

In the only European country linking the Alps, the Mediterranean, the Karst and the Pannonian Plain, everything is accessible within a relatively short drive. From the capital and central Slovenia you'll be in the remotest corners of Slovenia in just under two hours!

In a car or motorhome

You can travel around Slovenia by public transport or bicycle, but camping enthusiasts usually choose to use their own means of transport. A motorway crossroad brings them closer to the country and interesting local stretches of road, often linked to campsite locations, are particularly attractive.

Safely in the summer and in winter

In Slovenia, among the traffic regulations you should note the obligatory use of dipped (low-beam) headlights even during daytime driving. Use of fog lights is permitted only where visibility is reduced to less than 50 metres. The driver and all passengers in the vehicle must wear seat belts. A safety triangle, a spare set of light bulbs, a first aid kit and a reflective vest are compulsory equipment in cars. Winter equipment is compulsory from 15 November to 15 March. Winter tyres should have at least a 3-millimetre profile. If you have summer tyres, make sure you have snow chains in the car. Drive safe. Do not drink alcoholic beverages when driving!

Vehicle rental

You can rent a car at specialised agencies in towns and at airports. To rent a car you need to be at least 21 years old and have held a driving licence for at least two years. Some car rental agencies require a young driver surcharge payment for drivers aged between 21 and 25.

On motorways with an e-vignette

Motorcycles, passenger cars and vehicles with a maximum permissible weight not exceeding 3.5 tonnes must, in order to drive on Slovenian motorways and expressways operated and maintained by the toll road operator, be equipped with an e-vignette. You can choose among a weekly, monthly and annual e-vignette. It can be purchased online, at DarsGo dealerships and at authorised sales outlets. Attention The e-vignette must be paid before vignette must be paid before vignette motorway or expressive.

Petrol and charging stations

Petrol stations are located on motorways every 30 kilometres or so and they are open 24 hours a day to ensure that vehicles are adequately fuelled. The opening hours of the network of petrol and charging stations in other parts of Slovenia vary. Unleaded petrol and diesel are available at all stations, while some also offer LPG. There is also a growing network of electric charging points in Slovenian cities.

Electronic toll system for heavier vehicles

Vehicles with a maximum permissible weight of more than 3.5 tonnes are subject to the modern electronic toll collection system in freely flowing traffic - DarsGo. The Slovenian motorway network can only be used by heavy vehicles that are registered in the system and equipped with a DarsGo device. Toll charging is fully automated and based on the distance travelled.

Categorisation



Stars in Slovenian campsites

When choosing the right Slovenian campsite for you, you can rely on state categorisation.

All campsites in Slovenia, with the exception of tourist farms camping, have obligatory star categorisation (from 1 to 5) indicating the category of equipment and service quality. More stars mean a higher category.

One star campsites

The average size of the area for pitching a tent is at least 55 square metres. At least 40 percent of camping pitches have electric hook-ups.

Two star campsites

The average size of the area for pitching a tent is at least 60 square metres. At least 50 percent of camping pitches have electric hook-ups. The campsite has an internet access option.

Three star campsites

70 square metres. At least 70 percent of camping pitches pitches are marked. Camps also have hot water have electric hook-ups. Campsite also have a children's throughout and restaurant and shop selling food. playground, organised recreation for guests, a shop with food, and a restaurant or café, if there are no food and beverage establishments within 500 metres of the site.

Four star campsites

The average size of the area for pitching a tent is at least 80 square metres. At least 80 percent of camping pitches have electric hook-ups, and at least 30 percent of camping pitches are marked. Camps also have shop selling food and common social area for guests.

Five star campsites

The average size of the area for pitching a tent is at least 90 square metres. All camping pitches have The average size of the area for pitching a tent is at least electric hook-ups, and at least 50 percent of camping

Above standard glamping in Slovenia

Discover original accommodation, connected to nature, in all Slovenian regions.

According to Slovenian regulations, innovative accommodation in a natural environment with a touch of luxury is above standard supplemental offer of various accommodation and food establishments. In addition to campsites, glamping can also be available at hotels, motels, pensions, inns, bed and breakfasts, and holiday apartments. There is no official categorisation for glamping, but we have assessment criteria of specialised companies, who award categories to glamping sites (e.g. stars) as part of their brands. Minimum standards for every glamping accommodation site are sanitation, running water, and waste recycling containers.



Reliable motorhome rest areas

Stopping at a Slovenian rest area ensures a peaceful stay.

Slovenian regulations define motorhome sites as rounded, spatially and functionally regulated and equipped land areas intended for motorhome parking for the purpose of rest. The rest areas have an entrance ramp, flat surface with marked vehicle parking spots, electric hook-ups for all marked parking spots, running water, waste recycling containers and an area to drain black and grey water tanks. Slovenian motorhome rest areas are not categorised.

Mediterranean & Karst Slovenia

Global surprises from **sea** to **karst caves**



The Slovenian Karst, after which all the world's karst phenomena are named, is a land of many wonders. The underground world created by the water is interspersed with karst caves with dripstone formations and other features. Surprisingly diverse towns and traditional salt pans, still in operation, invite you to the shores of the Adriatic Sea. The countryside of green Istria is enriched by olive groves, while the nearby Brda and Vipava valleys boast vineyards and orchards.

Accommodation in the countryside in Mediterranean and Karst Slovenia is synonymous with real contact with the sea, but it also allows you to stay close to the sights, under a climbing wall, near a paragliding runway, above the entrance to a Karst cave, among vineyards, on the edge of a forest or in villages with a view.



Blue adventures in the shelter of green beauty

Come to the coast and discover the vineyard hills. Enjoy the green countryside and find yourself in the middle of a bustling Mediterranean city. Every day can be different!



A cave train among the mysteries of the Karst

Take a train ride to Postojna Cave, which is the most visited karst cave in Europe, on the world's oldest cave railway. Near the cave visit Predjama Castle – the largest cave castle the world. After experiencing underground and medieval mysteries, head to the intermittent Cerknica Lake, the Military History Park in Pivka and Snežnik Castle.

Among the white Lippizaners

In Lipica, which has been the cradle of the Lipizzaner since 1580, enjoy classical riding school performances. The tradition of breeding Lipizzaner horses in the world's oldest and largest stud farm is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The oldest Slovenian entry on the UNESCO list belongs to the Škocjan Caves, with the largest underground canyon in the world.





Sunny, fishermen's destination, green

Koper, the city of a hundred suns adorning Venetian palaces, has a surprising cultural heritage that also invites you to its green hinterland with its many olive groves. Close to the fishing town of Izola, once an island town, the Strunjan Nature Reserve is home to an 80-metre-high cliff, which is the highest on the Adriatic coast. Close to the spa town of Ankaran is the green splendour of Debeli Rtič Landscape Park.



The Vipava Valley and Brda are dotted with orchards, vineyards and famous wineries. The wines here are among the best natural wines in the world. In addition to gastronomic indulgence, there are plenty of opportunities for outdoor activities. Nova Gorica, which is a town on the Slovenian-Italian border, is famous for its gambling industry and, together with cross-border Gorizia, is the European Capital of Culture 2025.



The most recognisable town on the Slovenian Coast

Medieval Piran, with its walls, panoramic church and many sights, grew on the splendour of the salt from the Piran Salt Pans. The most beautiful town on the Slovenian coast is almost contiguous with the cosmopolitan Portorož, with its beaches, marina and one of the most comprehensive wellness offers in Europe. Stroll through the salt pans with the Museum of Salt Making and the open-air wellness area.




Alpine Slovenia

Among the tallest **mountains** and the **wildest waters**




Slovenia's highest regions are surprisingly rich in nature and biodiversity. They are particularly preserved in Triglav National Park, the Julian Alps Biosphere Reserve, the UNESCO Karavanke Geopark and other protected areas. Here you can camp in close proximity to outstanding natural attractions and at the same time near interesting towns with a distinctive cultural vibe.

The area attracts lovers of hiking, cycling, fishing and fly-fishing, quiet and adrenaline-filled experiences on crystal-clear rivers and lakes, and skiing and other winter sports. The Julian Alps, the Kamnik-Savinja Alps, the Karavanke Mountains and the Pohorje Mountains offer attractive mountain and sport centres as well as popular international competition venues.

On the brinks of Triglav National Park

Jasna Lake, Kranjska G

Discover stories of peace at the World War I sites. In Bohinj discover the peculiarities of life along Slovenia's largest permanent lake and on the mountains above it. Explore the world beneath Triglav, Slovenia's highest mountain, by hiking and cycling the stages of the Juliana Trail. Walk and hike responsibly! Before hiking to the welcoming huts in the mountains, take advantage of all the information and guidance from the Slovenian Mountaineering Association!

From sports venues to the sweetness of life

Planica, Kranjska Gora and Pokljuka are the venues for high-profile competitions in various winter sports, while the legendary Bled, with its island in the middle of the lake, attracts the world's best rowers. The oldest Slovenian castle has looked down on it from the cliff above the lake for more than a millennium. Try the Bled cream cake! Visit nearby historic Radovljica, the town of beekeeping and chocolate.



Above the city with the oldest grapevine in the world

In the centre of Maribor, which is Slovenia's second largest city, welcome a vine that is more than 450 years old. From the edge of the city the funicular takes you to Mariborsko Pohorje, with its exceptional opportunities for various forms of outdoor recreation On the other side of Pohorje, Rogla and the nearby spa in Zreče offer winter and summer outdoor ex per iences.



In the cultural capital of the Alps

Kranj, the city of France Prešeren, the famous Slovenian poet, and other important artists, lies along the canyon of the Kokra River - the second highest canyon next to a city in Europe. It impresses visitors with cultural events and active leisure opportunities in the surrounding area. On the other side of the Julian Alps, Cerkno invites visitors with its ethnographic features and modern ski resort and thermal baths.



Around Logarska dolina Valley and the Koroška region


In the Kamnik-Savinja Alps discover the special features of Logarska dolina Valley, which is considered to be one of the most beautiful glacial valleys in Europe and the Solčavsko region with its panoramic road. In the valleys beneath the peaks of the Geopark Karavanke, Koroška regiona attracts visitors with its mighty forests, mysterious underground mines, interesting cycling challenges and the recreationally attractive Kope resort.

Ljubljana & Central Slovenia

The liveliness of the **capital** and strolls in nature to **primeval forests**



Ljubljana's location in the heart of the green country makes it an excellent starting point for discovering all of Slovenia's special features. The capital city along Ljubljanica River impresses with its myriad faces of urban culture, the masterly architectural design created by Jože Plečnik, its museums and galleries, its festivals and events. The city and its hinterland are protected by a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and relatively short paths lead to mighty forests with primeval forest reserves, to mountains and ski slopes, to villages with a different vibe. You can stay in nature on the very doorstep of the capital, next to Slovenia's warmest and most attractive river, under the famous mountains and close to impressive sights.



Every day is a good day for new stories

In the heart of Slovenia, every day of the year offers a new reason to wander: among the trees of a city park or reserve, among the stories of people and different periods of the past.



Holidays in the lively capital

Ljubljana, which was voted Europe's best city for short breaks in 2023 by European Best Destinations, is truly worth discovering. Explore Plečnik's Ljubljana, a global urban planning phenomenon, and the Ljubljana Marshes with its colonial heritage (both UNESCO World Heritage Sites), climb the castle overlooking the city and enjoy the pulse of outdoor café culture. Explore the nature that extends into the city centre on foot or by bicycle and see Ljubljana from a »river perspective« by raft, kayak or boat.

The secrets of the mighty forests

Just 60 kilometres from the capital is the most complete forest habitat in Europe. Discover Kočevje and Krokar Rainforest, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, on hiking and cycling trails. You can search for bear tracks with a guide or explore the underground passages


of the former bunkers.





From the city to the mountain

Medieval Kamnik, with its artisans' street, two castles and a monastery, a nearby arboretum and spas, is connected to the pastoral Velika planina. The alpine pasture, which is also accessible by a cable car, is home to more than 60 ancient shepherd's huts, where shepherds graze their cows in the summer. Krvavec, which is a popular destination for outdoor adventurers in the summer and a popular ski resort in the winter, is not far away. It is accessible from Cerklje na Gorenjskem.



Dreamy sites by the warmest river

White birch trees and places of unique folklore, local crafts, wine and delicious cuisine invite you to Bela Krajina. Its most beautiful features are protected by Lahinja and Kolpa Landscape Parks. Kolpa River is the warmest river in Slovenia. The rapids are a delight for kayakers and canoeists and there are swimming areas in the slower areas with pools.


World Heritage treasures


Thermal Pannonian Slovenia

Well-being among thermal waters and wine-growing hills




From Pannonian Plain in the north-east to the hills of Dolenjska in the south-east, springs of healing thermal and mineral waters gurgle. Thermal Pannonian Slovenia is a land of famous natural spas and health resorts, wellness centres, winegrowing hills, castles and hospitable countryside. Here you camp in contact with the locals and with the feeling that the paths to well-being are always in front of you.

Visit the pools, spas and wellness centres and make the most of hiking and cycling trails, golf courses, story-telling towns and squares with the castles of noble families. Here you can discover the secrets of the proverbially delicious flavours of typical local cuisine.



Healthy and good living everywhere

Here, where your heart beats to the rhythm that's right for you, you can pamper yourself with thermal waters and discover how simple and luxurious healthy living can be.



Three different cities

In Celje explore the era of the famous Counts and Princes of Celje, for centuries Europe's most powerful noble family or follow the trail of the cosmopolitan traveller Alma Karlin. In nearby Velenje, which is the greenest mining town in Europe, be surprised by the lively pulse of the lakeside shore. In Ptuj, which is Slovenia's oldest city, meet the "kurenti" who are part of the UNESCO World Heritage Site. Spas and a golf course also await you here.

Among the treasures of the Iron Age

Novo mesto is the centre of Dolenjska, which is a hilly region along Krka River. It is considered to be a situl city thanks to the world-famous Iron Age archaeological sites. It is surrounded by wine-growing hills, where cviček wine is produced. Otočec Castle. which is set on an island in the middle of the river, and Šmarješke Toplice and Dolenjske Toplice health resorts are located nearby. The Gorjanci mountains are full of stories and invite you to explore them.



Metropolitanism of well-being

For centuries, one of Slovenia's most famous healing waters has been the mineral water with the highest magnesium content in the world, which originates in Rogaška Slatina - a health resort with a world-class diagnostic centre. The award-winning Terme Olimia in Podčetrtek is also one of the best wellness centres.



From Posavje to the oldest spas

Where Krka and Sava rivers join in southern Slovenia and the Kozjanski Park apples ripen not far away, Terme Čatež boasts the largest thermal riviera. The castles of Posavje are strung across the countryside along Sava River. Thermana Spa and Rimske Terme invite you to the brewery town of Laško, Terme Topolšica invites you to the shelter of the forests beneath the Kamnik-Savinja Alps and Terme Dobrna, with its 600-year tradition, invites you to stroll along the chestnut alley.



Healthy by River Mura

Pomurje, the region along River Mura, is famous for its hospitable countryside and numerous natural spas and health resorts. Choose to be pampered at the natural spas in Radenci and Moravske Toplice or at the wellness centres in Banovci, Lendava and Mala Nedelja. Delight your taste buds with culinary delights, spark your imagination in the largest castle in the Castle of Grad and relive the eruption of a volcano in Vulkanija Park.
